## Why Focus on Principles?

### Characteristics of True Principles (Audrey Rindlisbacher)

- · Foundational idea upon which behavior is based, it is not the application
- · True for all people, all the time
- · Creates greater freedom for the individual and society
- Enlightens the understanding, enlarges the soul, expands your mind, brings new connections and ideas.
- · Empowers and gives hope
- · Increases desire for good in thoughts, behavior, environment, and relationships
- · Generates growth, enlivens
- · Increases health and wholeness
- · Creates win / win situations

A principle is an enduring truth or rule individuals can adopt to guide them in making decisions. They are universal and help people apply the doctrines of the gospel to everyday living. -Gospel Teaching and Learning handbook (section 2.5)
